Old Testament Story: How grace overcomes our sin


- Acknowledge the horrendous nature of sin. 2 Chronicles 28:1-4; Romans 1:21-25 "Moreover, he burned incense in the valley of Ben-hinnom and burned his sons in fire, according to the abominations of the nations…"
- Recognize the consequences and price to be paid for our sin. 2 Chronicles 28:5-8 "For Pekah the son of Remaliah slew in Judah 120,000 in one day, all valiant men, because they had forsaken the LORD God of their fathers..."
- Seek God's grace and give it to others. He will graciously hold back the penalty of our sins. 2 Chronicles 28:9-15 "But a prophet of the LORD was there, whose name was Oded... Then the men who were designated by name arose, took the captives, and they clothed all their naked ones from the spoil; and they gave them clothes and sandals, fed them and gave them drink..."
- Humbly receive God's gracious gift of Christ through faith and repentance. 2 Chronicles 28:16-27 "For the LORD humbled Judah because of Ahaz king of Israel..." (v.19)

"Then the LORD spoke again to Ahaz, saying, 'Ask a sign for yourself from the LORD your God; make it deep as Sheol or high as heaven.' But Ahaz said, I will not ask...'" Isaiah 7:10-12

LIFEGROUP DISCUSSION:

King Ahaz ruled in an ever increasing evil fashion. But God still extended to him grace to turn him back to the Lord and care for the lives of his people.

2 Chronicles 28:9-15 describes an amazing grace from God to help these people that have suffered because of their own sins. God is a very patient God not willing for any to perish. He is longsuffering when we rebel against Him which is evident in this story. Read through 2 Chronicles 28:9-15 and identify the grace of God toward His people. For background, a prophet of God from Samaria (capital of Israel), Oded, confronts the northern kingdom regarding their treatment of Judah, the southern kingdom. He acknowledges that God used Israel to punish Judah for their rebellion. But now God is intervening to stop their heavy judgment against Judah. He calls them to offer grace to Judah. Where then do you see that grace being offered?

For our application: We are not called to offer judgment against other people. That is God's role. Rather, we are to offer God's grace and truth. We may want to judge those who are wrong, but, we have no right to do that. Note how God prevented the judgmental actions of Israel toward Judah in 2 Chronicles 28:10, 11.

Rather than judge and condemn others, how can you express love and grace to those that need the Lord from the following verses? What specific things can you do? Where have you experience God's grace or grace from other people?
