A LETTER FROM PASTOR DAVE

When Jesus began His public ministry, he encountered two men, Peter and Andrew, as they were fishing by the Sea of Galilee. These men might be considered some of His first converts. But what strikes me most is what Jesus did not request from them. He did not ask them to "invite Jesus into their hearts," nor "accept Him as their Savior," nor "just believe in Jesus" for their salvation. His request was much deeper because His desire for their commitment was much longer than a mere decision of faith.

What Jesus did request from them included two basic words: "Follow Me." He would then take responsibility to "make" them into "fishers of men." Later Jesus found James and his brother John. They also chose to "follow Him." This pattern has continued to this day.

Now there is nothing wrong with inviting people to "accept" Christ as their Savior. All do need to be truly saved by faith alone. But that request is incomplete if we are to fulfill the mission of Christ. There is something terribly wrong if a new convert does not "follow" Jesus. Jesus' expectation for any that claim to believe in Him is that they follow Him.

Following Jesus means Jesus will " $m\alpha ke$ " my heart, attitude, behavior, mind and relationships like His, so as I become like Jesus I too can reach others that will also "follow" Him. Simply put, following Jesus is allowing Jesus to " $m\alpha ke$ " me like Jesus so I live like Jesus.

At Calvary, we believe in this calling because of Christ's last command to us in us in Matthew 28:19-20: "Go therefore and make disciples of all the nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father and the Son and the Holy Spirit, teaching them to observe all that I commanded you; and "SIMPLY PUT. FOLLOWING JESUS IS ALLOWING JESUS SO I LIVE LIKE JESUS." lo, I am with you always, even to the end of the age." So we are called to "make disciples" not just make decisions

Often many of us feel inadequate or illequipped for this calling. We think we don't have what it takes or enough knowledge to help make disciples that follow Jesus. I have some good news for you. As you join us in this new series you will be empowered and equipped to fulfill Christ's plan where we each are truly following Him and being made into those disciples that call other people to follow Jesus. I suspect many of you are already "making disciples" but do not realize how you are helping those around you to follow Jesus.

Please faithfully join us for each week of the Mulitply series to learn how you can more fully participate in one of the most fulfilling and satisfying experiences of life as a follower of Jesus – helping people you love follow Jesus.

WHAT IS DISCIPLESHIP?

What are we talking about when we talk about discipleship? We are talking about a lifelong process of FOLLOWING Jesus. We are talking about not just acquiring information, but INTEGRATING our faith into every area of our life. We are talking about MULTIPLYING our impact for the kingdom of God through life-changing, Christ-centered relationships as we model and teach this life of following Jesus in a way that is transferable to the lives of others.

Discipleship is a call to learn to live in the way that Jesus did, following His teaching and example, loving people the way He loved people, and investing in people even when it takes a sacrifice on our part. Discipleship is not just learning to recite the right answer, but actually being transformed in such a way that we obey the teachings we have learned and live differently because of how we have encountered Jesus.

Discipleship is also about multiplication. If you want to know how your life can make an impact, and how you can maximize your effectiveness for the kingdom of God, discipleship is the answer. It's good if you've learned how to follow Jesus and walk in His ways.

It's better if you can also help those around you start walking in this kind of life.

It's best if you can reproduce the life of walking with Jesus with those around you, and expect them to multiply this life into others as well.

Discipleship matters. It's at the core of Jesus' teachings, and as His followers we're called to be about the business of making disciples. Because of the importance of this topic, we are setting aside an entire month at Calvary to create time and space to have some conversations, talk about what next steps we can pursue, call one another to follow Jesus, and learn how to make disciples who will make disciples. "For we never came with flattering speech, as you know, nor with a pretext for greed—God is witness—nor did we seek glory from men, either from you or from others, even though as apostles of Christ we might have asserted our authority. Check out the following points and discuss how these components are helpful in a discipleship relationship.

Discipleship:

- Involves quality time Acts 20:18, 31 - "with you the whole time."
- Requires emotional vulnerability Acts 20:19, 31 - "tears"
- Walks with people through difficult times and opposition Acts 20:19 - "trials"
- Needs an attitude of humility and not pride Acts 20:19 - "serving the Lord with all humility"
- Happens in the context of homes Acts 20:20 - "from house to house"
- Is willing to go to any person regardless of background Acts 20:21 - "both to Jews and Greeks"
- Fosters genuine love toward each other Acts 20:37-38 - "they embraced Paul"

Discussion Questions:

- How much time do you think "quality time" is? Why is this essential?
- Why do you think emotional vulnerability, on the part of Paul/ disciplemakers, is important? What do you think healthy emotional vulnerability looks like?
- Which of these from the list would be most desirable in someone who you would want to disciple you Why?
- Which of these is the most challenging for you to think about doing in your own relationships?

DISCIPLE LIKE JESUS -FOUR PHASES OF DISCIPLESHIP BY JESUS

ERIC WAKELING - EXECUTIVE PASTOR OF MINISTRIES / SEPTEMBER 14, 2014

Come and See John 1:38-39

• Jesus exposed them to the nature of his ministry in John 1:35 - 4:46.

• Jesus' model was to tell them what was involved and why this was necessary.

Come and Follow Me Mark 1:16-20

• Jesus was demonstrating interest to train them to follow him.

• Jesus' model was to show them how to do it and then do it with them.

Come and Be with Me (in the work of ministry) Matthew 9:37-38

• During this time, Jesus gave them special responsibility and authority (Matthew 9:37-10:1). He planned to pass his work on to them, prepared them for their new responsibility and sent them out in twos while demonstrating, explaining, experimenting and clarifying what was on his heart.

• Jesus' model was to let them do ministry and then deploy them into their own ministry.

Remain in Me John 15:7-8

• John 13-17 records Jesus' last days and final instructions before he releases his disciples to minister.

• The commission does not signify the end of a relationship but a change in the relationship, for the Holy Spirit would now lead them (John 14).



Journal Questions:

How are you feeling about discipling someone or a few people after hearing more about Jesus' model of discipleship? Pray through any insecurities or hindrances.

Write down as many things as you can think of about how Jesus acted with His disciples. What did He do? What did He say? How did He treat them differently than others? How did He speak to them? How did He pray?

What can you glean from these things for your efforts in discipling others?

INVESTING IN THE NEXT GENERATION

Sixty-six years ago, in the summer of 1948, Calvary hired their first youth pastor. Fifty-one years later, in 1999, I walked into the gym as a high school freshman. Fifteen years after that, I am now the pastor of Calvary's High School Ministry and I am honored to lead this group of wonderful students! I am writing this to ask you for something. Something that Student Ministries at Calvary has never had – a home.

It is in the very nature of any group to desire a home. Every family longs for a place that is their own. Every nation wants to know its borders. The Israelites wandered in anticipation for their promised land. Even you want your own space. When we have a home, we are free to live without the worry of having to leave. We build roots, we create tradition and we flourish.

For 66 years, Students Ministries has been wandering around Calvary. We move to whichever room is empty at the time, and we leave the moment we are done. There are obviously a lot of difficulties to moving and roaming around campus, hauling equipment, setting up chairs, meeting in spaces that are too large or too small, but those are not the things that bother me. What bothers me is that students at Calvary do not have a place to call 'home' within their church body. They do not have a place to grow roots. They do not have a home to create tradition in. They live with the reality that they always have to leave. Never once on a Sunday morning have we been able say to our students, "This place is yours. Settle in and make it your home." Instead, every Sunday we ask over 300 students to leave. They don't have to leave our campus, but they are not welcome to stay in the place where they gathered for worship. They do not have a place. They do not have a home.

To invest in the next generation would be to give them a home, build them a room and allow them to move in, fully, to show them they are part of the family. God has been so faithful to Student Ministries at Calvary over the years. Let's take the vision that began 66 years ago to the next level - **to have a ministry for young people that brings them in, calls them home, and creates a space for them to plant life-long roots.** When we invest our resources in students to grow as followers of Jesus they will become the future of Calvary and the future of Christianity.

Discipleship is not a program. Instead, it's a relationship in which two people journey through life together while learning to obey the teachings of Jesus.

Being a disciple requires an open, teachable spirit willing to spend time with someone who wants to help you follow Jesus and experience the best life possible. Being a disciple-maker doesn't require perfection; simply a life of character and obedience that reflects the Apostle Paul's words, "Be imitators of me, just as I also am of Christ." (1 Corinthians 11:1). Start praying today about whether or not God is calling you to be a disciple, a disciplemaker, or both!

Discipleship begins with a friendship. Whether you are called to be a disciple or a disciple-maker, consider making a new friend who could walk through life with you. You might identify this person in a LifeGroup, at a church event or by serving together. However you meet, get to know them in a casual way. Ask them questions, take a hike together, or sit with them in church and engage with them after the service.

Once you identify someone you connect with, take the next step to ask if they might want to enter into a type of a purposeful friendship called Discipleship. While they might jump at the chance to spend more time with you, not everyone is ready or available to disciple or be discipled; some have yet to understand discipleship. Others may be committed to other things and unable to add one more thing to their already full plate. If they don't enthusiastically respond, don't be disappointed. Instead, look around to see who else God might have for you.

Once you have purposed to be in a discipling relationship, meet together, talk about your expectations and how you want to be growing. Then get started!

Begin with prayer. Ask God what role He has for you in discipleship.

Get involved. Join a LifeGroup. Attend an intergenerational event. Serve with others. Make friends at church.

Look around. Who is God putting on your heart? Which friendships in your life could become more purposeful?

Take the next step. Ask someone if they would like to enter a discipleship relationship with you, as a disciple or a disciple-maker. Be flexible. Be willing to ask someone else if this person is currently unavailable. And trust the Holy Spirit to guide you in this process.

Discipleship is more like a 'Jackson Pollack' than a 'Thomas Kinkade'

- Discipleship can be messy because people, life & relationships are messy "But when Simon Peter saw that, he fell down at Jesus' feet, saying, 'Go away from me Lord, for I am a sinful man!'" (Luke 5:8)
- Some of Peter's abstract, unpredictable, frustrating and messy moments with Jesus:
 - Peter rebuked Jesus and was called 'Satan' (Matthew 16:21-23, Mark 8:32-33)
 - Peter stumbled in the water (Matthew 4:18-19)
 - · Peter foolishly offered to build a tabernacle for Jesus (Luke 9:32-34)
 - · Peter wondered whether following Jesus was worth it (Matthew 19:27)
 - Peter misunderstood Jesus at the Last Supper (John 13:6-9)
 - · Peter fell asleep when Jesus asked him to pray (Matthew 26:40)
 - Peter fought in the garden (John 18:9-11)
 - · Peter denied knowing Jesus (Matthew 26:69-74)





TURNING TO SCRIPTURE

John 1:12 tells us that we become children of God.


Romans 10:9 tells us that we will be saved.

This tells us about the confidence we can have about our eternal destination. One of the crippling doubts for any relationship is the question, "Will it last?". How can knowing the eternal status of your relationship with God give you confidence in your relationship with Him today?

Ephesians 1:13 tells us that we are sealed with the Holy Spirit.

In Biblical times, a king would put a wax seal, with his special imprint or stamp, on a document. This seal communicated that whatever was inside this document had the king's seal of approval. It also carried with it the idea of ownership or identification. But we are not sealed with wax; God's seal of approval and ownership is accomplished through giving us the Holy Spirit (Step 6 of "Following Jesus" will explain more about who the Holy Spirit is.) How can this image of being sealed with the Holy Spirit help further your confidence in this relationship?





My Life

Romans 6:23 says that "the wages of sin is death." If a wage is something you earn, then what is earned by living our lives apart from God's will is to spend the rest of our lives apart from God. This is the "death" talked about in Romans. This is the path that we were all on. The good news is that God has made it possible for us to have a right relationship with Him and made a way for us to have life!

Read 1 John 5:11-13. According to these verses, there are only two options: if we have the Son of God, we have life. If we do not have the Son of God, we do not have life. All we have to do is believe and put our trust in Jesus!

Where would you put yourself on the picture above? On a scale of 0% -100%, how confident are you that you have a relationship with God?

If we believe in Jesus as the Son of God who lived a sinless life, died on the cross. was raised from the grave, and conquered sin and death, we can have 100% confidence that we have begun our new life with God, and that this relationship will continue into eternity in heaven!

<u>1 John 5:11-13</u>

STEP 1 / CONFIDENCE IN YOUR DECISION TO FOLLOW JESUS

NEXT STEPS

As you have begun this new relationship and life with God, it is important to take steps and keep growing in your faith. A theology that stops at salvation is missing the full life Jesus offers. God invites us to grow up-to mature and become like Christ. Following Jesus is a process, a journey, not a one-time decision.

In any relationship, it is normal to experience doubts. Times will come when you may experience doubt in your relationship with God. And that's okay! When you experience doubts, it's important to be honest about them and seek the answers you need.

One answer you can always have confidence in is that if you have believed in Jesus, you can have 100% certainty that you have a relationship with God and have begun a new life with Him. Our confidence for this is not because of anything we have done, but because of the complete work of Christ on our behalf!

Here's a few things you can do this week to grow in your confidence:

- When we experience doubt, it is good to remember the truths of Scripture. Try to read John 1:12 every day this week to remind yourself of the confidence you can have as a child of God.
- Read the Gospel of John and look for evidence that Jesus is the Son of God. Also, keep an eye out for how many times Jesus says to believe in Him.
- If you want to examine the evidence for Jesus outside of the Bible, check out the book *The Case for Christ* by Lee Strobel, or *More than a Carpenter* by Josh McDowell.

- Accept unconditionally
- Embrace messiness
- Model vulnerability
- Listen attentively

How can I be a better listener?

• Attending: Listening in such a way that the person feels heard and understood

Reflecting:

Responding compassionately with content and questions that show you heard them

HOW CAN I ASK GOOD QUESTIONS?

Try asking some of these:

- How is God inviting you into a deeper relationship with Himself?
- How is God inviting you into a deeper relationship with people in your life?
- How is God inviting you to trust Him more deeply in a circumstance or area of your life?
- Are there any relationships where you need to seek reconciliation?
- How do you see God being with you in your life right now?
- Is there something you think God is asking you to give up, either permanently or for a season?
- Can you identify any harmful patterns/habits God is inviting you to change?
- What would it look like to trust God more in a current challenge?
- Are there any relationships in your life right now where you think God is asking you to love or forgive someone who has hurt you?
- What have you been learning about God recently?
- What have you been learning about yourself recently?
- What have you been learning about healthy relationships recently?
- What are some things that you are thankful for right now?
- How are you actively pursuing God right now?
- What is an area of your life where God is inviting you to die to your self?
- How have you invested in the important relationships in your life this week?
- What is something you're looking forward to?
- Is there anything in life you are dreading right now?
- Is there anything in life you are anxious about right now?
- What steps are you taking to follow God more completely with your life?
- Is there anything in your life you are holding back from God?
- Is there anything God is asking you to take a step of faith in, but you are hesitant to take that step?
- Are there any areas of your life that feel out of balance?
- Are there any decisions you are wrestling with?
- What else is going on in your life?

What is the bottom line?

If you can **listen, ask good questions, and pray**, you have all that you need to begin discipling someone! These basic skills will equip you to walk alongside someone and provide a loving and gracious environment that will help them start growing in their faith!

"If we really want to help someone grow, we will have to help them in a way that fits their wiring. Our great model for this is God himself, for he always knows just what each person needs.

He had Abraham take a walk, Elijah take a nap, Joshua take a lap, and Adam take the rap. He gave Moses a 40-year time out, he gave David a harp and a dance, and he gave Paul a pen and a scroll. He wrestled with Jacob, argued with Job, whispered to Elijah, warned Cain, and comforted Hagar. He gave Aaron an altar, Miriam a song, Gideon a fleece, Peter a name, and Elisha a mantle. Jesus was stern with the rich young ruler, tender with the woman caught in adultery, patient with the disciples, blistering with the scribes, gentle with the children, and gracious with the thief on the cross.

God never grows two people the same way. God is a hand-crafter, not a massproducer. And now it is your turn.

God has existed from eternity, but he wants to do a new thing with you. The problem many people face when it comes to spiritual growth is that they listen to someone they think of as the expert—maybe the pastor of their church—talk about what he does, and think that is what they are supposed to do. When it doesn't work for them—because they are a different person!—they feel guilty and inadequate. They often give up. But spiritual growth is hand-crafted, not mass-produced. God does not do 'one-size-fits-all'."

Most Christian parents would give anything to anchor their children with a vibrant faith that "sticks" and continues to mature into adulthood. Yet, despite this deep desire, research indicates that 40-50% of high school seniors drift from their faith after graduation. Through personal, real-world experiences of research and sharing, this six-week video-driven class will present powerful strategies and practical ideas to help you as parents encourage your children's spiritual growth, enabling them to develop a deep and lasting faith that sticks.


