God's grace for the barren. Galatians 4:22-30

"For it is written that Abraham had two sons, one by the bondwoman and one by the free woman. But the son by the bondwoman was born according to the flesh, and the son by the free woman through the promise." (Galatians 4:22-23)



God's grace for us all. Galatians 4:31-5:1

"So then, brethren, we are not children of a bondwoman, but of the free woman. It was for freedom that Christ set us free; therefore keep standing firm and do not be subject again to a yoke of slavery." (Galatians 4:31-5:1)

"Salvation in Christ does not rest in a law that we inevitably break; it rests on a promise that God cannot break." Phillip Ryken

Digging Deeper

Paul is going out of his way in Galatians 4 to make the point that the Galatians cannot take their salvation into their own hands. Throughout Scripture God confounds our assumptions by doing the impossible, whether it is allowing a 90 year old Sarah to give birth to a son of the promise named Isaac, or a virgin named Mary giving birth to our promised Savior named Jesus.

• The gospel found in Matthew 1

"She will bear a Son; and you shall call His name Jesus, for He will save His people from their sins." Now all this took place to fulfill what was spoken by the Lord through the prophet: "Behold, the virgin shall be with child and shall bear a Son, and they shall call His name Immanuel," which translated means, 'God with us.'" (Matthew 1:21-23)

• The gospel found in Isaiah 54

"Shout for joy, O barren one, you who have borne no child; Break forth into joyful shouting and cry aloud, you who have not travailed; For the sons of the desolate one will be more numerous Than the sons of the married woman," says the Lord." (Isaiah 54:1)

• The gospel found in Luke 15

"But he answered and said to his father, 'Look! For so many years I have been serving you and I have never neglected a command of yours; and yet you have never given me a young goat, so that I might celebrate with my friends; but when this son of yours came, who has devoured your wealth with prostitutes, you killed the fattened calf for him."" (Luke 15:29-30)

• The gospel found in Matthew 21

"Truly I say to you that the tax collectors and prostitutes will get into the kingdom of God before you. For John came to you in the way of righteousness and you did not believe him; but the tax collectors and prostitutes did believe him..." (Galatians 3:23-24)

- 1. As you look at the chart on the front side of this outline, what has been your relationship to obeying the law and relying on the law?
- 2. We learned today about the heartbreak of Abraham and Sarah taking matters into their own hands with regard to the promise God had made for them to have a son. They made it 10 years before they moved to their own "Plan B" and brought Hagar into the situation. Have you ever given up on God to follow through in your life and taken matters into your own hands? In what ways can you identify with Sarah?
- 3. Have you ever seen God do the miraculous in your life or the lives of people around you?
